

STLY % change




#### **Number of newly submitted manuscripts – Taiwan**




#### **COVID-19 related manuscripts**



STLY % change








#### **Usage impact - Taiwan**

- Submission was still increasing, acceptance rate wasn't affected much,
- Most of submission growth was around health sciences related subjects,
- Peer review time was improved and number of submitted COVID-19 related manuscripts is going back to normal level,
- Usage was growing even during global lockdown period (roughly March to June),
- Taiwan is using its own experience to contribute and support global community.
