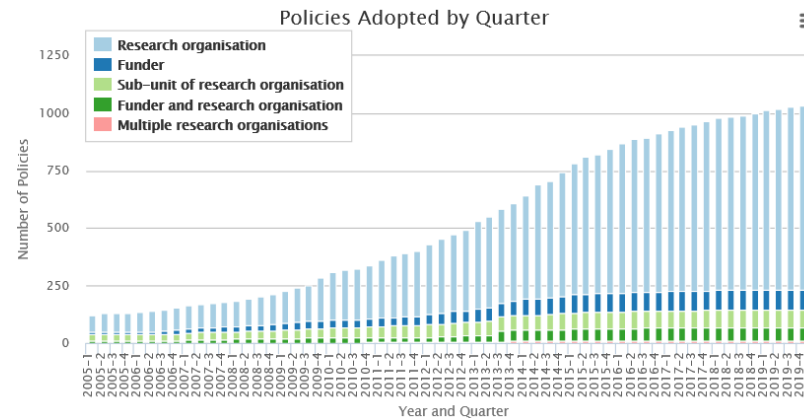


Open Access: A growing global, movement

Grounded in shared declarations

- Budapest Open Access Initiative Dec. '01
 - Convened by Open Society Institute (OSI)
 - www.soros.org/openaccess/
 - 30,000 signatories, but no enabling mechanisms
- Berlin Declaration Oct. '03
 - www.zim.mpg.de/openaccess-berlin/berlindeclaration.html
 - Combined science & humanities; signatories agreed on open archive principles and committed to enabling them at home
 - Started Registry of Institutional OA Self-Archiving Policies

Supported by policy changes

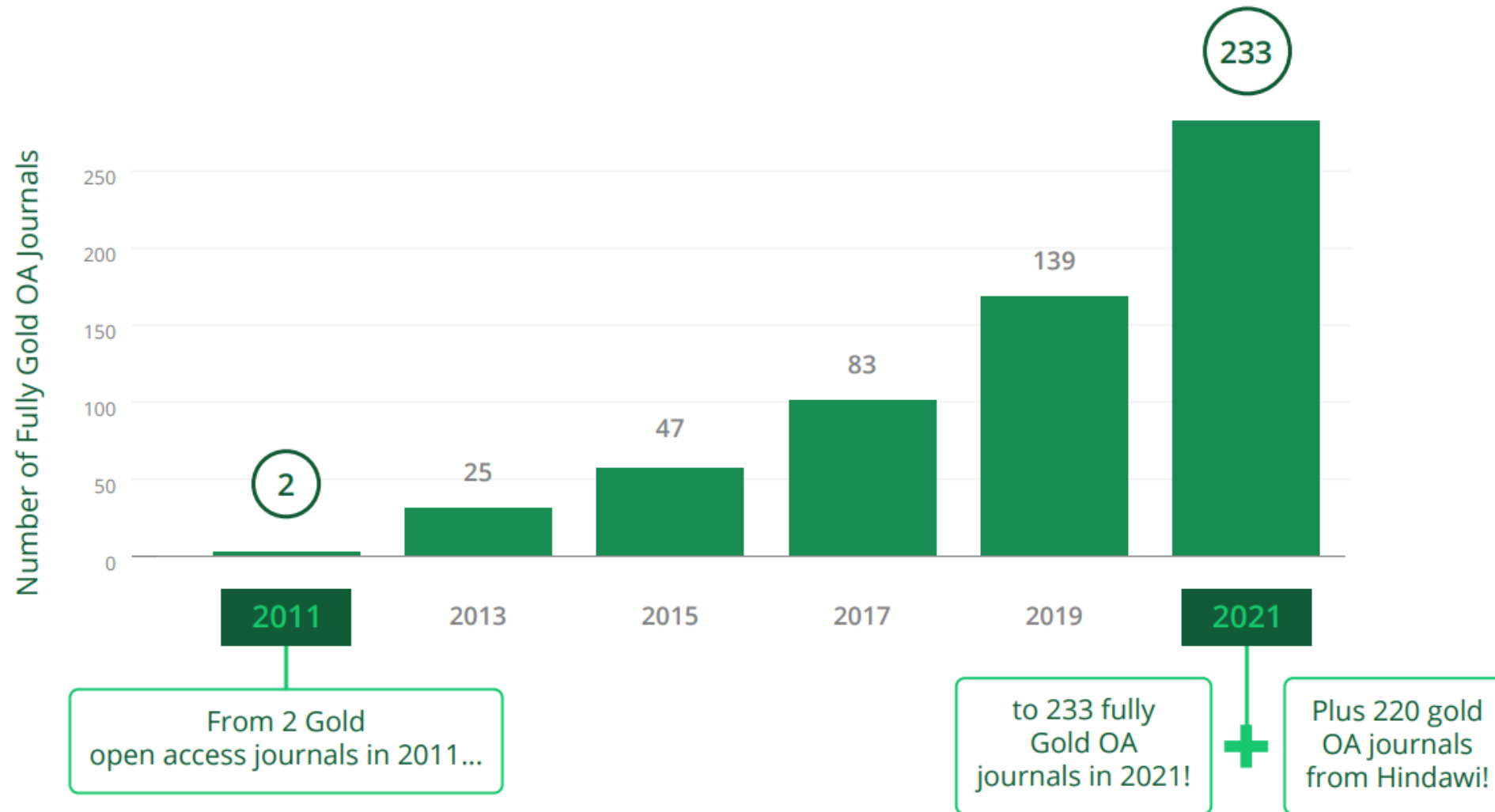


1,1000+ OA policies in place globally

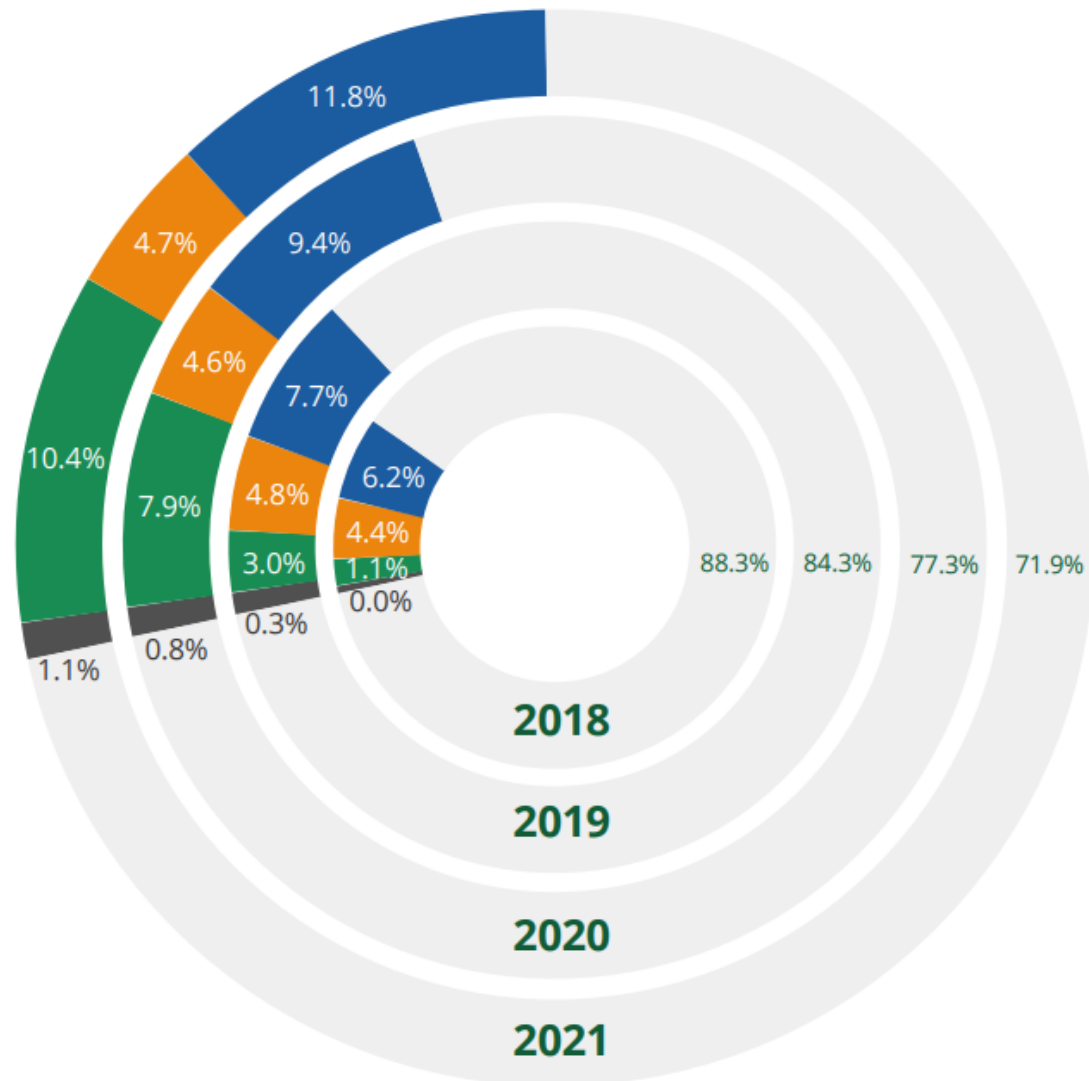
Increasingly in the public eye

There's a lag between an article being accepted and it officially appearing within an issue.

Most articles however are available to read at acceptance. This means a good proportion of the articles accepted in 2021 will be published within an issue in 2022.
